



Roles and Responsibilities of Community Health Officer

OBJECTIVES


By the end of the session CHOs will be able to:

- To understand the role in community.
- To improve the functional capacity of the HWC.
- To strengthen the public health activities related to preventive and promotive health.
- To improve clinical management and care coordination.

RATIONALE FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH OFFICER

- To improve the healthcare access and coverage in rural and remote areas.
- To improve the continuum of care.
- To reduce over load on secondary and tertiary health facilities
- To increase the utilization of public health services at primary level.

Role and responsibility of CHO



A. Clinical Functions

1. Early detection, screening and first level management.

- Identify and provide first level management -12 essential package of services.
- Communicable disease screening TB, leprosy, Filariasis etc.
- NCD Screening Hypertension, Diabetes, Cancer Breast, Cervix and Oral

2. Undertake referral to enable continuum of care

- High Risk cases, complications, medical emergencies
- Guidance for Contraceptive methods/limiting methods.
- Children 0-18 years –assessment for 4Ds
- Cases with tertiary/secondary care under PMJAY

3. Provide follow up care

- High Risk Pregnancy, LBW children, monitor due lists by ANMs.
- Sexual and Reproductive Health for FP,AH, RTI / STI
- NCD clinics-treatment compliance, adherence to lifestyle modifications
- Home visit for palliative care individuals.
- Post surgical follow-ups.

4. Facilitate Teleconsultation

- Confirm continuation of treatment with PHC Medical Officer.
- Seek advice for pre referral stabilization/first aid.

5. Provide Counselling support

- Addressing risk factors for NCD, lifestyle modifications.
- Antenatal, Postnatal Care, Essential Newborn Care, WASH
- Sexual and Reproductive Health for FP,AH, RTI / STI
- Prevention of vector borne diseases ,prevention of infectious diseases TB, Leprosy, HIV/AIDS .
- Additional services like Mental Health, awareness and stigma reduction.

B. Public Health Functions

1. Collection of population –based data and planning of services at HWC

- Listing population/households, maintain database.
- Supervise data collection by frontline workers, collation and analysis of population data
- 'Understand and act' on demographic process like- Fertility, mortality, marriage, migration and social mobility

2. Disease Surveillance

- Continuous vigilance towards agent, host and environmental factors affecting disease outbreak/epidemic.
- Verify and inform authorities of response to disease outbreak.
- Support the medical team or joint investigation teams for disease outbreak.

3. Community level –for health promotion

- To address social determinants of health and promote behavior change for improved health outcome in coordination with VHSNC and PRI members
- Work on environmental determinants like safe potable water, sanitation, safe collection of waste, proper disposal of waste water, indoor air pollution, specific environmental hazards etc.
- Guide and be actively engaged in health promotion campaigns in a year.
- Conduct VHSNC and VHSND meetings.

C. Managerial Functions

1. Recording ,Reporting, Monitoring of service delivery

- Support and supervise the collection of data by MPW.
- Maintain records at HWC-OPD, investigations, services, family folders.
- Timely submission of monthly performance report for PBI
- Ensure timely and accurate reporting of services provided at HWCs
- Supervisory reporting at Block or PHC level through monthly meetings

2. Administrative functions of HWCs

- Inventory management and Indentation.
- Proper utilization of HWC untied fund

3. Supportive Supervision of HWC Team

- Conduct monthly meetings with MPW and ASHA
- Monitor VHSND,VHNSC meetings
- Conduct visits where ASHA/MPW need additional support.
- Facilitate **multi-sectoral convergence** for action.
